

Community defibrillators

We are a small community but we have a lot of visitors; functioning defibrillators are essential.



Three collecting boxes, as pictured below, have been purchased and will be offered to The Bog Centre, the Stiperstones Inn and the Stiperstones Shop to collect money to help maintain

defibrillator boxes in our area. They require new pads and batteries every few years depending on type and use, a necessary, but not insignificant cost.

Our boxes should not be locked and to maintain battery life, they should be maintained within a specific temperature range.

There is no evidence of attempted theft where boxes are not locked in Chirbury and Worthen or of children misusing the equipment. Children are not at risk because the defibrillator will not emit a charge if a heartbeat is detected.

The British Heart Foundation recommends that all defibrillators are registered with the Circuit. It is the national defibrillator network which connects defibrillators to NHS ambulance services across the UK and provides reminders about the upkeep of individual defibrillators.



9 out of 10 cardiac arrests happen at home or in the workplace, 60,000/year not in hospital in the UK. The chances of surviving sudden cardiac arrest drop by 10% for every minute CPR and defibrillation is delayed. 



Notes from the hill

Every year we note the date of the first cuckoo that we hear on the Stiperstones, and it has ranged between the 15th of April and the 13th of May, but invariably is around the end of April. This year I heard a cuckoo calling outside of my office on the 29th of March which is on average a whole month early. I imagine that this was a bird moving through on migration as the cold snap at the beginning of May seemed to put a halt to most arrivals and indeed most bird song on the hill. The heathland is not only a good spot for breeding cuckoo but also seems to be a staging post on migration as we have had some very late records too. Cuckoos like to feed on caterpillars, particularly big caterpillars and the heathland supports a good number of large moths like the fox moth that in larvae form are the big dark hairy caterpillars that can often be seen crossing the tracks up on the hill.

A key part of managing the Stiperstones is the grazing of animals. Too much grazing and heathland tends to move towards grassland and too little and it succeeds to woodland. In order to get sufficient grazing over the hill Natural England encourage the farms with common rights on the hill to graze a mix of cattle and sheep. Away from the common we use graziers with cattle and of course we have our own flock of Hebridean sheep and Exmoor ponies. On top of this we have a few natural grazers like roe deer and hares.



Getting the right grazing animals and the right amount of grazing across the hill is a difficulty that we wrestle with regularly, however this year we have the help of a shepherd, funded by the Common Cause project, who will be assisting with moving animals to less grazed areas of the hill.

One particularly relevant issue regarding grazing is uncontrolled dogs. In the last 'Notes from the Hill' I talked about their effect on the ground nesting birds on the Stiperstones, however since then there has been a dog attack on livestock next to the nature reserve. Another reason why we ask that dogs are kept on a lead on the site is the danger they represent in respect to grazing animals. The worse cases of dog attacks on the nature reserve have been where local dogs have run loose on the hill, so if anyone sees loose dogs, they should report them to the police.

Letter from Westminster – May 2022

Ambulance Response Times



I know there has been considerable concern locally about delays to ambulance responses to emergency calls from South Shropshire. I assure you I am also very anxious about ambulance response times.

West Midlands Ambulance Service do acknowledge ambulance response times are not at all near to where they need to be for Shropshire. From their own statistics which I have requested and seen, the reason behind this is clear - the issue has been exacerbated by long delays to handovers at hospital, which prevents crews from getting back out on the road.

This has been building since last July when many covid restrictions were lifted. I have been engaging with WMAS and NHS leaders in Shropshire more frequently than usual since then, and have met WMAS senior leaders, most recently in January, March and April, to discuss response times across South Shropshire. I have also raised specific cases where constituents have suffered very lengthy delays for ambulances (mostly in non life-threatening emergencies, it must be stressed).

Following my conversations with the WMAS Chief Executive, I am calling on Shropshire CCG for more support to recruit and train more ambulance crews, so we can put more ambulances on the road in Shropshire, while patients wait to be handed over at hospitals. I am also engaging with our acute hospitals, to ensure they do all they can to speed up handovers, to return as soon as possible to the efficiency they have managed previously.

Having been out on shifts with WMAS ambulances, I know they move directly from call to call, with around half of their attendances in Shropshire currently leading to conveyance of a patient to hospital. Crews start and end their day in an ambulance hub to collect and return their vehicle, but are otherwise on the road attending calls. So a return to localised hubs won't fix this issue. But I am also working with WMAS to encourage more community first responders.

Community First Responders act as a rapid first point of contact in emergencies, before an ambulance can arrive. They are trained by WMAS to provide basic lifesaving care, and work as volunteers in the community around their schedules. In incidences of cardiac arrest, CFRs and members of the public trained in CPR and the use of the defibrillators in the community can be the difference between life and death, particularly in rural locations, as after a cardiac arrest, for every minute that no-one is doing CPR, the chance of survival drops by 10%.

When I spoke to the Chief Executive of WMAS in March, I raised my concern that there were no live adverts to recruit Community First Responders in the West Midlands. He put this right rapidly, and applications for the next course went live the next day. If you or anyone you know are interested, please visit www.jobs.nhs.uk and search for "WMAS".

I also suggested a programme of engagement by WMAS with the public in South Shropshire. So at my request WMAS arranged for staff to be on hand at Ludlow Market Square on Saturday 23rd April, to exhibit their vehicles and answer questions from the public about the process of joining as a Community First Responder. I was really pleased with the response from WMAS and the public, so will be looking to repeat this pilot in other towns in South Shropshire.

I shall continue to work with WMAS and SaTH to do all I can to see ambulance response times improve in South Shropshire.

He was deposed twice from the throne of Naples: once by the revolutionary Parthenopean Republic for six months in 1799 and again by Napoleon in 1805, before being restored in 1816.







Born in 1926, Princess Elizabeth became queen on the death of her father, King George VI, in 1952. She married Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, in 1947 and the couple had four children: Charles, Anne, Andrew and Edward.



A former prince of Denmark and Greece, Prince Philip was born in 1921 and served in the British Royal Navy in World War Two. He was the longest-serving consort of any British monarch, and retired from royal duties in 2017 having completed more than 22,000 solo engagements.

He died on 9 April 2021.

1952 THAT WAS THE YEAR THAT WAS

5 January – Prime Minister Winston Churchill arrives in the United States for an official visit and talks with President Harry S. Truman.

10 January – An Aer Lingus Douglas DC-3 aircraft on a London–Dublin flight crashes in Wales due to vertical draft in the mountains of Snowdonia, killing twenty passengers and the three crew.

16 January – Sooty, Harry Corbett's glove puppet bear, first appears on BBC Television.

30 January – British troops remain in Korea, where they have spent the last eighteen months, after a breakdown of talks that were aimed at ending the Korean War.

1 February – The first TV detector van is commissioned in the UK, as the beginning of a clampdown on the estimated 150,000 British households that watch television illegally without a licence.



6 February – King George VI dies at Sandringham House aged 56 early this morning. It is revealed that he had been suffering from lung cancer. He is succeeded by his 25-year-old daughter, Princess Elizabeth, Duchess of Edinburgh, who ascends to the throne as Queen Elizabeth II. The new Queen is on a visit to Kenya at the time of her father's death and returns to London the

following day. She will be the longest-lived and longest-reigning British monarch, with a reign exceeding 70 years.

14 February–25 February – Great Britain and Northern Ireland compete at the Winter Olympics in Oslo and win one gold medal.


15 February – The funeral of King George VI takes place at St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle. His body has been lying in state in Westminster Hall since 11 February.

21 February – Compulsory identity cards, issued during World War II, are abolished.

26 February – Prime Minister Winston Churchill announces that the United Kingdom has an atomic bomb.



2 May – The De Havilland Comet becomes the world's first jet airliner, with a maiden flight from London to Johannesburg.



21 May – Eastcastle Street robbery: a post office van is held up in the West End of London and £287,000 (worth £8,189,519.66 in 2019) stolen, Britain's largest post-war robbery up to this date; the robbers are never caught.

1 June – One shilling charge is introduced for prescription drugs dispensed under the National Health Service.


5 July – The last of the original trams runs in London; the citizens of London turn out in force to say farewell.

19 July–3 August – Great Britain and Northern Ireland compete at the Olympics in Helsinki and win 1 gold, 2 silver and 8 bronze medals.

16 August – Lynmouth Flood: 34 people killed in a flood at Lynmouth in Devon. Many other people are injured and numerous buildings are damaged.

19 September – English film star Charlie Chaplin, sailing to the United Kingdom with his family for the premiere of his film *Limelight* (London, 16 October), is told that he will be refused re-entry to the United States until he has been investigated by the U.S. Immigration Service. He chooses to remain in Europe.

3 October – Operation Hurricane: The UK explodes its first atomic bomb in the Monte Bello Islands, Australia.



5 October – Tea rationing ends, after thirteen years, as announced by the Government two days earlier.

8 October – Harrow and Wealdstone rail crash in North London claims the lives of 108 people.

19 October – A small Welsh republican group, Y Gweriniaethwyr, make an unsuccessful attempt to blow up a water pipeline leading from the Claerwen dam in mid Wales to Birmingham. The Claerwen reservoir is officially opened on 23

October.

November – Royal College of General Practitioners established.

14 November – The magazine *New Musical Express* publishes the first UK Singles Chart.

25 November – Agatha Christie's play *The Mousetrap* starts its run at the New Ambassadors Theatre in London. It will still be running in London as of 2022, having transferred next door to St Martin's Theatre in 1974.

4–9 December – Great Smog blankets London, causing transport chaos and, it is believed, around 4,000 deaths.

29 November – First GPO pillar box of the reign of Queen Elizabeth II to be erected in Scotland, on the Inch housing estate in Edinburgh, is attacked in protest at its bearing the Royal Cipher of Elizabeth II, considered historically incorrect in Scotland.

12 December – BBC children's television series *Flower Pot Men* debuts.

25 December – The Queen makes her first Christmas speech to the Commonwealth.

December – End of Utility Furniture Scheme.



Additional support for landowners with diseased trees and woodlands in the Shropshire Hills



With new and emerging tree diseases, the health of our local woodlands continues to be of some concern. Ash dieback, a disease caused by the fungal pathogen *Hymenoscyphus fraxineus*, is spreading across the UK and its impact is accelerating in the Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB).

The loss of ash, along with the wildlife it supports, both at a woodland scale and as an individual tree will have a significant impact on the Shropshire Hills landscape. We hope to limit this by promoting sensitive management to safeguard remaining ash trees and woodlands.

A recently launched Forestry Commission tree health pilot grant scheme is providing additional support for landowners with disease affected trees and woodlands. The Shropshire Hills is one of four protected landscapes where this pilot is being run.

It is targeted within the AONB and where there may be risk to the public from diseased trees. Grants are specific to each species and rates vary dependent on whether trees are within or outside of a woodland setting. The following tree species are eligible:

Ash with dieback (*Hymenoscyphus fraxineus*)
Larch with *Phytophthora ramorum*
Sweet chestnut with blight (*Cryphonectria parasitica*) or *Phytophthora ramorum*

Dependent on species and woodland setting there is support for road closures, protected species surveys, restocking and maintenance, felling, chemical killing, Infrastructure/access and biosecurity. There is also funding for infrastructure to isolated and hard to reach woodlands.

These grants are in addition to the Countryside Stewardship Tree Health Scheme. For more information about the scheme, along with information about managing ash dieback, see: <https://www.shropshirehillsaonb.co.uk/news/tree-health-pilot-grant-scheme>


