Octogenarian Funds Five Lifesaving Missions

Snailbeach man, Doug Boulter, 82, along with his friends has helped fund five critical care car missions for Midlands Air Ambulance Charity.

Eighty-two-year-old Doug with "support crew" Vicki, Jo, Thelma, Emma and Claire completed a four and a half mile sponsored walk across the rugged terrain of the forest and farmland in Snailbeach, in aid of the lifesaving pre-hospital emergency service. Doug raised in excess of £1,300 funding five of Midlands Air Ambulance Charity's critical care car missions.

A longstanding supporter of Midlands Air Ambulance Charity, Doug has fundraised for the service on multiple occasions in the past. Following a recent incident which was attended in the local area and required the enhanced pre-hospital expertise of the charity's aircrew, Doug challenged himself to start fundraising again, this time with a physical challenge.

Doug Boulter said: "I would like to thank everyone who supported us so generously with their kind donations and for sponsoring our walk."

Maria Jones, Shropshire fundraising executive for Midlands Air Ambulance Charity, added: "It is thanks to generous people, like Doug, who participate in challenges and sponsored walks and their kind supporters who donate, within the local community, that we are able to keep our helicopters in the skies and our critical care cars on the road.

"I'd like to say a huge well done and thank you to Doug his loyal support over the years and for his continued fundraising efforts."

Come! will you not go where the bilberries grow, On their beautiful bushes of green; Whose ruby bells smiled in the desolate wild, On the far away moorland scene?



This August has not given us good whimberry picking weather

but then what is good whimberry picking weather. I am a child of the fifties and probably the last generation to pick whimberries as part of our family income but for a very long time local people have picked whimberries in the valleys and on the slopes of the Stiperstones hills. It was often fun out on the hill chatting and calling to each other in fine weather but sometimes we were wet or bitten or stung and always we were stained and dirty.

So important was the income from whimberry picking to the local economy that older people talk about walking long distances to pick them. People walked from Pontesbury and Minsterley to the Stiperstones Rhadley and the Longmynd. There were often more pickers than whimberries which prompted the long trek. Joe Smout said several families walked together from Pontesbury to the Stiperstones. A breakfast stop was made at the edge of May Salters field where they mashed tea and some of them cooked bacon before they started to pick. Some dealers came to the hill to collect whimberries from the pickers but often they would pick all day and then carry heavy baskets home for cleaning ready for collection.

They were not picking to have money for a holiday. The whimberry picking was the holiday but it wasn't always enjoyable. The school register for Minsterley records that many children were absent for whimberry picking and other farm labouring activities before and probably after the official summer break. They were picking so that they could afford essentials like shoes and clothes for the winter.

As a teenager in the early 1960s I was considered old enough to take the whimberries I had picked to sell at the Market Hall in Shrewsbury. I would pick the whimberries during the week ready to sell on a Saturday. Cleaning them was a laborious business but every tiny leaf or bit of grig had to be removed. In our family we used trays for cleaning. A small pile of whimberries was placed at the narrow edge of the tray and then any debris was picked out as they were rolled slowly to the other end of the tray. The cleaned whimberries were piled into a basket lined with grease proof paper ready to be carried into town on Bert's early morning bus.

The Market hall was a huge building with bricks or terracotta on the outside and imposing steps up to the main floor. It was cool in summer and I imagine it was freezing cold in winter. On a Saturday morning the market was bustling and full of life so there would be plenty of customers about. Trestle tables were arranged in rows for people like me to sell produce. I can't recall what I paid to have about a yard of space at the end of one of these trestle tables. I measured the whimberries with a stamped half pint beer mug and they were sold at so much a pint. Half a crown a pint comes to mind but that seems like a lot of money looking back. The whimberries must have been decanted into paper bags, plastic bags were not so readily available then I think. I imagine that the juice would soak through the bag before the whimberries reached the customers home. Adults sometimes asked asked where the whimberries came from and then commented that they had picked on the hills when they were younger. Those customers knew picking whimberries was no picnic. Volunteering at The Bog Visitor Centre

Since reopening following the Covid lock down period the Centre has struggled with staffing its daily shifts. Covid protocols and an increase in the number of visitors have stretched our resources in terms of volunteers available to staff shifts and we are therefore keen to add to our list of available volunteers. The shift rota is



flexible and volunteers cover as many or as few shifts as they wish. In a normal year the staff carry out their first hours as volunteers and thereafter at an hourly rate of minimum pay. Currently staff are being paid the hourly rate as will any new staff joining the team this year. Next season we will revert to the voluntary element of 30 hours.

Our friendly team of volunteers is aged between 16 and 80 plus and new staff receive three shifts of training alongside our more experienced members. The role of staff is to provide a welcoming atmosphere for our visitors, to provide information about walks, local history and the landscape and also to serve visitors with refreshments.

Opening hours are currently 11am – 4pm Tuesday to Friday and 10am – 5pm Saturday and Sunday, the weekend days being split into two shifts. The centre is closed on Mondays.



NATURAL ENGLAND Notes from the hill



This is the time of the year when the hill looks at its best, due to the common heather being in full bloom, turning the heathland a deep lilac-purple. Common heather or Ling is as the name suggests, the commonest of three species of heather found on the Stiperstones. Naturally it would be a found scattered sparsely underneath birch and oak woodlands and on rocky outcrops. The large expanses of heather called heaths are almost always the result of human tree clearance and subsequent grazing of livestock on poor acid soils. The Stiperstones is no exception and may well have been heathland since the iron age.

Ling has had a variety of uses by man over the years including fodder, bedding and building materials. The flowers can be used to make an orange dye, a sweet tea and have been used for flavouring beer and gin. It is favoured by beekeepers for making heather honey, which is supposed to have beneficial properties for bladder and kidney complaints.

Although large expanses of heather moorland can sometimes seem a bit monotonous, they are particularly important for a number of bird species, not least of which is the red grouse, a sub species of willow grouse that is only found in the British Isles and is dependent upon heather as a food plant. Another

bird that is found in particularly high densities on heathland is the meadow pipit that nests on the ground under the heather. On moorlands the meadow pipit is the most common bird used as a host to raise cuckoo chicks. So ultimately its due to heather that we have a good population of cuckoos on the Stiperstones.



Heather is also important for a range of insects and invertebrates; the shrub structure is important for spiders, bare ground can be important for beetles, bees and ants and a number of moth caterpillars feed exclusively on heather.


Two other species of heather can also be found on the Stiperstones: bell heather which is found on the south facing slopes and flowers earlier than Ling and the cross-leaved heather that can be found in some of the wetter areas of the hill. These heathers are similar, both being Erica's, but the cross-leaved heather has flowers that cluster on one side of the stem.

The Shropshire Hills Hay Meadow Festival, which this year was held at the Discovery Centre in Craven arms, was a great success with over 500 people attending and a great range of stalls, music, activities and of course scything. The festival is aimed at raising awareness of the value of flower rich hay meadows in the area.

The other bit of good news is that the Stepping Stones Landscape scale conservation project has been successful in their bid to Natural England for funding under the Green Recovery Fund.

New landscape investment to deliver local benefits for climate, nature, people and place

A 3-year Defra funded programme for farmers and land managers in Protected Landscapes (Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and National Parks) in England has been launched.

Here in the Shropshire Hills Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB), over £700,000 is available to distribute this year to projects linked to farming that can demonstrate benefits to climate, nature, people and place.

The Shropshire Hills AONB Partnership is supporting farmers and land managers to apply for grants to carry out projects that support nature recovery, mitigate the impacts of climate change, provide opportunities for people to discover, enjoy and understand the landscape and cultural heritage, or support nature-friendly, sustainable farm businesses.

The programme is open to farmers and land managers (including from the private, public and charity sector) with land within the Shropshire Hills AONB.

Protected Landscapes are special areas and need to be managed, enhanced and protected while also supporting the farmers and communities who work within them and the wider local economy. Farmers and land managers are being encouraged to look at project opportunities on their holdings and to get in touch with the Shropshire Hills AONB Partnership to discuss them.

Farming in Protected Landscapes Adviser, Alison Jones, will be able to offer advice, help with the development of projects and guide individuals through the application process.

Letter to Westminster – September 2021 Road to COP26

With the upcoming COP26 UN Climate Conference in Glasgow in November, more focus is rightly being placed on what steps we can take beforehand to demonstrate global leadership in the fight against climate change.



The Prime Minister laid out his vision of a Green Industrial Revolution last year, and shortly thereafter published an Energy White Paper to set the framework for the next critical phase of renewable energy rollout. But there remain several detailed strategies of how to get there still awaiting publication, now expected in coming weeks, as part of the preparation for COP26.

Last month the UN's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) released their latest report, making clear the impact of human activity on global temperatures, and the vital need to take action to avoid a climate catastrophe.

As Chairman of the Environmental Audit Committee, I have been vocal in saying the government needs to meet rhetoric with action. The private sector, galvanised by a mix of greater awareness of environmental issues by senior management and the realisation customers expect companies to play a role in combatting climate change, is ready and willing to invest. But government needs to set a clear direction, to drive investment into net zero technologies.

Unfortunately, industry's confidence has taken several knocks by delayed strategies and some cancellation of policies. The Green Homes Grant voucher scheme for owner occupiers to make energy efficiency improvements for their homes, since cancelled, was overly bureaucratic, and proved difficult to access for both building contractors and homeowners.

Notwithstanding this, to its credit the government has outlined significant ambition on net zero. But there are deep rooted challenges. There remains a shortage of skills in green engineering disciplines, the green automotive sector and qualified installers for energy efficiency measures like heat pumps or insulation retrofits.

The Environmental Audit Committee has undertaken a number of inquiries to help inform debate around achieving Net Zero Britain, and to provide recommendations to government on how to focus policy. Homes account for 20% of the UK's greenhouse gas emissions, but there is significant underestimation in government of the cost of addressing this, and we are still awaiting a Heat & Buildings Strategy.

To support the move to electric vehicles, we must invest in Gigafactory capacity for battery production and EV charging capacity, as other countries have. There have been some encouraging announcements on investment in battery plants recently. But grid connection and regulatory issues continue to hold back community energy schemes, as well as tidal power and further progress in our offshore wind sector – which has proven a real UK success story.

Of course, COP26 is an international conference, and fostering international commitments to combat climate change must be the focus. The UK has made admirable progress in cutting our emissions while growing the economy. So we are well placed to demonstrate to developing nations that combatting climate change does not mean curtailing growth or improving living standards for their citizens. The UK government must seek to be a benchmark to inspire others.

I have been promoting community engagement in COP26, including through presenting the COP26 President, Alok Sharma MP, with a community action plan from South Shropshire Climate Action. I have encouraged local schools to give pupils the opportunity to learn more about COP26 and the issues it is seeking to address. Next month I am hoping to arrange screening locally an educational film on the environment for young people.




