

Worthen Medical Practice Flu vaccination Clinics Autumn 2020



This year flu vaccination clinics will be held at the village hall next to the surgery to support social distancing due to the covid-19 pandemic. Please follow the advice of the staff when you arrive for your vaccination. Clinics will be held in October on a variety of days and times to give patients a choice of when to attend. This year clinics will again be 'by appointment' which means that you will be given a time to arrive for your flu vaccination.

Please wear your face mask when you attend for your appointment. Please do not wear bulky clothing to help ensure all appointments run to time.

If you are eligible for the flu vaccine please call in or ring the surgery on 01743 891401 to make your appointment. If you are unsure if you are eligible please ask one of the reception staff who will be able to advise you.

The government has announced that it wants all patients aged 50 – 64 to have a flu vaccine this year once the other groups have been vaccinated. We are waiting for further details of this. If you are in this group please ring the surgery in mid-October to book your flu appointment. Please check our Facebook page and website for the latest information.

How effective is the flu vaccine?

Flu vaccine is the best protection we have against an unpredictable virus that can cause unpleasant illness in children and severe illness and death among at-risk groups, including older people, pregnant women and people with an underlying physical health condition.

Studies have shown that the flu vaccine will help prevent you getting the flu.

It will not stop all flu viruses and the level of protection may vary, so it's not a 100% guarantee that you'll be flu-free.

But if you do get flu after vaccination, it's likely to be milder and shorter-lived than it would otherwise have been.

There's also evidence to suggest that the flu vaccine can reduce your risk of having a stroke.

Over time, protection from the injected flu vaccine gradually decreases and flu strains often change.

New flu vaccines are produced each year, which is why people advised to have the flu vaccine need it every year.

Notes from the hill

Well it has been the strangest of years so far, but hopefully things are returning a bit more to normality on the Stiperstones. Natural England Staff are back on site as we are allowed to carry out 'non-essential' work, although I would argue that all of our work is essential to the management of the site. Our volunteers are starting back with us, where they can, and where we can ensure suitably socially distanced tasks. The obvious task being the scything of the bracken, as no one is likely to come within two metres if someone is wielding a scythe.

We are still seeing a lot of visitors to the reserve, it must be a record year for visitors, and the car park is generally busy these days, even on weekdays. Sometimes hidden away in the Secret Hills we forget what a busy island we live on. All the more reason to make more space for nature, and hopefully some of you will have seen BBC Countryfile explaining the vision of the Stepping Stones Project the other day.

You don't get much air-time on a short programme like Countryfile, so to update you



a bit more fully, the main aim is to establish habitat links between and around the key wildlife sites of the Stiperstones and the Long Mynd, allowing wildlife to move across the area, and thus making it more resilient to climate and other changes that are happening now, and are likely to increase the threat to our wildlife in the future. The project is progressing despite the Covid lockdown with the start of volunteer activities, such as green hay collected from churchyards being spread on nearby verges. A bilberry bumblebee project started up and an appeal to purchase Cudwell Meadow, south of Church Stretton was launched. Verges are being managed for wildflowers and the Marches

Meadow Group have purchased a snazzy new seed collector. There are also some exciting woodland and riverine projects in the pipeline. For more information on the Stepping Stones project and how you can help out contact charlie.bell@nationaltrust.org.uk.

The dry weather on the hill has been good for insects, with good numbers of butterflies, moths and dragonflies. These have attracted a hobby that can often be seen hunting over the heather particularly at the top of the steep dingles on the West side of the hill. Hobbies are extremely agile falcons. They can sometimes be mistaken for peregrine falcons as they sometimes stoop after prey with closed wings. They both have pale cheeks and black moustaches, however they are smaller and thinner winged and are generally more agile in flight. They can often be seen catching insects on the wing and later when the martins and swallows are gathering will turn their attention to them. If you have the time it is worth sitting at the top of Mytton Dingle or Perkins Beach and watching the hobby, kestrel or ravens as they play in the updraft.

Whatever it is, get out there and start picking and cooking and baking and preserving or just eating the beauties straight off the bush.

Blackberry Pie Bars Recipe

Crumbly moist pie dough with sweet juicy blackberries combine to make these Blackberry Pie Bars! Get the deliciousness of pie without rolling out the pie dough! Prep Time 15 minutes

Cook Time 45 minutes

Total Time 1 hour

Ingredients

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 cups sugar, divided
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

Zest and juice of one lemon, divided

- 1 cup (2 sticks) cold unsalted butter, cut into 1 inch slices
 - 1 large egg
 - 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
 - 4 cups fresh blackberries
 - 4 teaspoons cornstarch

Instructions

Preheat the oven to 375°F. Grease a 9×13 inch pan. In a food processor, pulse together flour, 1 cup of sugar, baking powder, cinnamon salt and lemon zest. Add the butter, egg and vanilla extra. Pulsing until dough is crumbly.

Pat half of dough into the bottom of the prepared pan, saving the remaining dough for the topping.

In a medium bowl, stir together the remaining 1/2 cup sugar, cornstarch and lemon juice. Gently mix in the blackberries. Sprinkle the blackberry mixture evenly over the crust. Crumble remaining dough over the berry layer.



Bake in preheated oven for about 45 minutes, or until top is slightly brown (you are only looking for the top to slightly brown.

Reforms to the planning system – Letter from Westminster, September 2020



Planning how as a society we decide what buildings get built where, to serve which need, is one of the perennial conundrums of local and national politics. There is no right answer which will satisfy everyone. So devising a system of decision-making which achieves the myriad objectives of those who need to live and work in buildings, during a time of population growth when not enough homes have been built, calls for radical action.

The government has had some success in reforming the planning system since 2010, with the National Planning Policy Framework contributing to more local involvement in deciding how our communities develop, and cutting away red tape. Together, the changes have meant that last year we delivered over 241,000 homes, more new homes than at any point in the last 30 years, all while continuing to protect our environment, heritage and Green Belt.

But frustratingly, the ambition to own your own home remains a distant dream for many young people. There is a significant generational divide, as demand for housing has grown but supply has failed to keep up. Aside from the relative price stability in the mid-1990s, and the financial crash of 2008, house prices have grown consistently over the years.

We cannot ignore the effect our planning system has on the supply of housing. Local authorities take on average seven years to generate a comprehensive housing plan for an area. Developers take on average five years to get permission to build. As we have seen in South Shropshire this can often be followed by very slow delivery of homes with the roads, schools, hospitals and other community infrastructure support their occupants require.

Last month the government launched 'Planning for the Future', setting out proposals to facilitate a more diverse and competitive housing industry, in which smaller builders can thrive alongside the big players, where all pay a fair share of the costs of infrastructure and the affordable housing communities require and where planning permissions are more swiftly turned into homes.

This Green Paper is subject to full public consultation. I would encourage local residents to have their say before the deadline of 29th October. Full details of the consultation can be found at https://www.gov.uk/government/consultations/planning-for-the-future.

In addition to these long-term changes, the government introduced new rules to boost housing density in the short-term, allowing residential blocks of three storeys or more, as well as terrace buildings in certain commercial uses and mixed-use buildings, to extend upward to create new self-contained homes. A new right on demolition and rebuilding will support the regeneration of vacant and redundant buildings that no longer effectively serve their original purpose, support housing delivery and boost housing density.

These changes should help deliver the growing need for housing while also reducing pressure to build on greenfield sites. Exemptions exist for National Parks, Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and conservation areas.

The reforms come at a crucial time, since a new Future Homes Standard for all new homes is being developed to ensure that housing quality and energy efficiency continues to improve across the country. I shall be keenly holding Government to account (as chairman of the Environmental Audit Committee) to raise energy efficiency standards of all new buildings, including those constructed under Permitted Development Rights.

This too is under public consultation until the end of this month, so I encourage all those concerned to look at the proposals and have your say at https://shropshire.gov.uk/get-involved/reg-18-pre-submission-draft-local-plan-consultation/.

My hope is that these changes, taken together, will result in a good supply of housing in Shropshire, that takes into account local views. But this is dependent on as many people as possible having your say through these public consultations, to help frame our communities for the future.



Weather News.

This summer of 2020 saw us experience a major

heatwave, Which started in the last week of May reaching 83.0°F on the 26th June.

Then the weather broke up in amazing thunderstorms, I have never seen lighting like that for many years here. The thunderstorm on the 12th August saw heavy rainfall of 40.0mm, nearly 2ins, in just 3hrs. Once again not quite a record but pretty close, as my record was 2.5ins in one hour some years ago.

It does very much seem that the planet is getting warmer, what with huge fires in California and major typhoons in Asia to hurricanes and tropical storms in southern USA.





Heather's Report for September Snailbeach News

Housing - The Shropshire Local Plan. Shropshire Council has published its latest Local Plan which outlines what land will be allocated to housing in our communities amongst other things..

The Snailbeach/Stiperstones area will now be regarded as open countryside. This means that there will be no open market houses built in the future. This will take effect when the plan is adopted in late 2021/22.

Roads. - Due largely to the chaotic relationship between Shropshire Council and the roads contractor KIER, an increasing number of road repairs are occurring at the 'drop of a hat' giving little or no warning to communities that road disruption is going to take place. A few weeks ago we had the A488 closing abruptly and now we have had the B4386 road to Shrewsbury. I have complained in the strongest terms that Communities (and this is a Shropshire wide phenomena) need proper notice of any work that is likely to cause disruption.

We are also still suffering potholes being topdressed and gullies being tarred and white lined. This has now hopefully been remedied on the A488.







Keep Shropshire Warm is a partnership between Shropshire Council and The Marches Energy Agency, promoting energy efficiency and energy conservation throughout the county.

Keep Shropshire Warm are particularly keen to hear from owner occupiers and private tenants who are off the mains gas network and have old, inefficient or broken boilers or heating systems.

Any householders who still require loft or cavity wall insulation should also qualify for funding and for the first time, old electric storage heaters are also eligible for upgrades.

Shropshire Council has widened the criteria for funding by taking part in the government's new ECO 'Flexible Eligibility' initiative, in the hope that more local householders will benefit.

Oliver Rothwell, Project Manager at Keep Shropshire Warm said:

"This new criteria offers a great opportunity for residents in Shropshire to access financial help with heating replacements and insulation upgrades. I would encourage any households who are struggling with old and inefficient heating systems to call Keep Shropshire Warm without delay, even if you have previously been turned down for support."

Funding is available to households on a low income with household members who have a health condition, are over the age of 60 or have children under five living at the property. If you are on a low income and not in one of these categories, you may still qualify if you spend a lot of money on heating your home.




